










GAP BETWEEN HIGHER AND LOWER TARIFF PROVIDERS INCREASES




















LARGEST GROWTH AND DECLINE SUBJECT AREAS


Biggest percentage changes in ECD applications by subject group (CAH1), 2025






HOW DO ACCEPTANCE RATES VARY By Course?






TOPPING THE CHARTS: What is happening with predicted grades?




Overprediction did not increase in 2024


