

Disability support

Sample questions

You probably have lots of questions about the support available to you, but here are some suggestions to get you started:

- If I declare my disability on my UCAS application, where will this information go, and what will be done with it?
- How current must my testing be to ensure I'm eligible for support and accommodation?
- What financial support is available? For example, clarification on eligibility for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA).
- Are there any additional bursaries or awards I may be eligible for?
- Is there blue badge parking available on campus (and near student accommodation)?
- What assistive technology is available? Is there an AT expert at the uni?
- Will the disability officer be able to discuss my needs with my course tutor, or should I contact them directly?
- How is information about my Education, Health, and Care (EHC) plan, or statement of special needs, passed to you?
- What accommodation options are available? Is it possible to stay in uni accommodation for the whole course, or will I be expected to move out after the first year?
- Is there accommodation for my professional carer?
- Do you participate in the Volunteering Matters scheme (or other voluntary projects)? If so, how can I find out more about being matched with a volunteer?
- Could I arrive on campus before the start of term to get used to the new surroundings? Can you provide support for anyone who is anxious about change?
- If I need to store medicines or sharps in my room, do you arrange a clinical waste collection?
- Are medical/dental services available on campus, or do I need to register with the local GP/dentist?
- Is there any support in place if I get behind on my studies and assignments because I need to attend hospital, or am unable to attend for longer periods of time?

If you have already visited the university or college and identified potential issues, it's a good idea to raise these with the disability officer early to see how they can be addressed.
