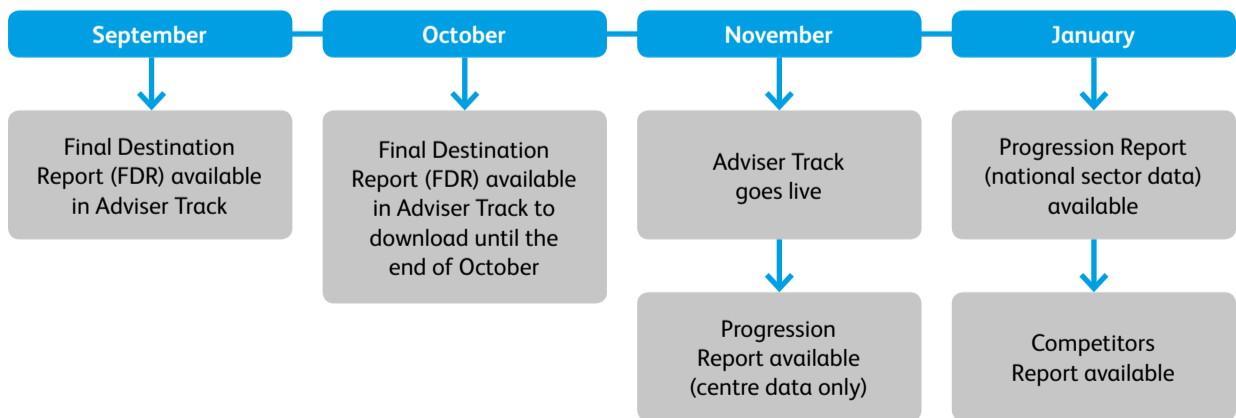

Adviser Track and Reporting

Once you have become a UCAS centre you will have access to Apply for advisers, which is free. You can monitor, advise, and check your students' UCAS applications from the start – adding references and submitting applications to UCAS.

Apply for advisers	Enables you to monitor, advise, and check your students' UCAS Undergraduate applications from the start – adding references and submitting them to UCAS. Adviser Track	Enables you to keep up-to-date with your students' applications, so you can track decisions and offers from unis and colleges. Applicant Status Report (ASR)	A report that lists all your students, their choice of universities / colleges, their offers and replies to date.	A macro tool is now available on ucas.com to reformat, filter, and sort in Adviser Track.	Updated every Saturday. Final Destination Report (FDR)	This report replaces the ASRs towards the end of the cycle, due to the high number of changes of applicant destinations at this time.	This replaces the ASR in Adviser Track.	Released towards the end of the cycle (end of August and end of September).	It is part of an Adviser Track subscription.		
Progression Report	The Progression Report reveals not only which university a student progressed on to, but also the offers they received. It now includes a key statistic summary, making it easier to understand and share your results.	The Progression Report is released in two parts, so advisers can access as much information as soon as possible. Part one includes the individual choice and applicant CSV files. Part two includes a report for the whole sector.	Part one is available from early November. Part two is available from early January in each admissions cycle.	UCAS Correspondents who have subscribed will be emailed a link with personal sign in details, to download the file from a secure digital platform.	£180 + VAT (for the complete Progression Report). Competitors Report	Compare your destination data with your choice of up to 25 other centres. Data includes subjects applied for, acceptances, and a breakdown of applicant characteristics – e.g. age, gender, ethnicity, and Tariff band.
