Dates and Deadlines for 2026

Last month we announced the following changes to dates and deadlines for 2026:

- The January Equal Consideration Deadline will be 14 January 2026.
- We are re-introducing the end-of-March advisory deadline to encourage earlier decision-making.
- The reject-by-default deadline will be 13 May 2026.

Apprenticeships allocated UCAS Tariff points in 2025

Starting with 2026 entry, Level 3 apprenticeships (England, Wales, NI) and SCQF Level 6 (Scotland) will be awarded Tariff points based on time spent

in study/work and competency with standardised size and grade bands ensuring equal points for apprenticeships of the same duration across the UK.
